- COMPASS (computerized test)
Math – 39 Reading – 81
Writing – 59 Essay – 6
- ASSET (paper and pencil)
Math – 38 Reading – 41
Writing – 40 Essay – 6
- MAPS (paper and pencil)
Math – 613 Reading – 114
Writing – 310 Essay – 6
- ACCUPLACER (computerized test)
Math – 63 Reading – 78
Writing – 80 Essay – 6

If you fall below the passing level on one or more parts of the substitute test, you must follow all the appropriate THEA rules and must re-test using the official THEA test itself (either paper/pencil test or Institutional “Quick” THEA).

THEA QUICK TEST INFORMATION

1. What is the THEA?

The THEA Test is designed to provide information about the reading, mathematics, and writing skills of each student entering a Texas public college or university. Each section of the THEA Test is designed to measure a student's academic skills against an established standard of competence. Your score on each section of the test is based on your performance in relation to the skills being tested. Scores are not related to how well other students have performed on the same section. Passing scores are as follows

Reading 230

Math 230

Writing 220 Essay 7

2. How does Quick THEA differ from the National THEA?

- The Quick THEA dates are more frequent.
- The Quick THEA score arrives in the Admissions Office of the College in approximately one week.
- The test dates are normally on a weekday.
- Registration is held on campus in the Testing Center. (Monday's Only 1:00 -5:30 p.m.)

3. How often can you take the Quick THEA?

You are allowed to take the Quick THEA every **30 days**. The 30-day rule applies to everyone even if you only tested on one subject the previous test date.

4. How much is the Quick THEA?

The Quick THEA exam is **\$39.00**. First payment of \$10.00 at the time of registration; then \$29.00 check or money order payable to **NES** on exam day.

5. If I pass the Quick THEA in the middle of the semester must I continue my remedial class?

Yes, unless you receive your score prior to the final withdrawal deadline. See Financial Aid Office if you are receiving financial aid.

Calculator Policy

Examinees may use a four-function, non-programmable calculator (with square root and percent keys). Examinees must bring their own calculators. Examinees will not be allowed to share a calculator.

Examples of calculators that may **NOT** be used follow (list is not exhaustive):

- Scientific or Graphing Calculators
- Calculator watches
- Pocket organizers
- Handheld, laptop, or notebook computers
- Electronic writing or pen-input devices
- Calculators with an alpha-numeric keypad
- Calculators with paper tape
- Calculators that make noise
- Calculators with electric cords
- Business or financial planning calculators
- Cellular Phones with Calculator functions

THEA EXEMPTIONS

Students who earned three or more college-level credit hours before the beginning of the Fall 1989 semester are exempt from the THEA requirement unless they are seeking teacher certification in the state of Texas. Documentation of this credit must be made available to the Registrar's office in order to claim this exemption.

Students with the following test scores may claim exemption from the THEA requirement if the scores are not more than five years old. (Note: There is a three-year age limit on TAAS scores.) Documentation of these test scores must be provided to the Registrar's office in order to claim this exemption.

- SAT total of 1070 & verbal 500 & math 500- SAT test dates April 1995 & later
- SAT total of 970 & verbal 420 & math 470- SAT test dates before April 1995
- ACT composite of 23 with english 19 & math 19
- TAAS writing 1770 & reading 89 & math 86
- TAKS language arts 2200 & essay 3 & math 2200
